

PUBLIC INVOLVEMENT MEETING

RECONSTRUCTION OF CTH O & CTH C BRIDGES OVER AMES & BONNER BRANCH LAFAYETTE COUNTY

January 13, 2022

9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.

The reconstruction of the CTH O bridge over Ames Branch and CTH C bridge over Bonner Branch will be discussed at a public involvement meeting scheduled by Lafayette County in Wisconsin.

The meeting will be held on Thursday, January 13th, 2022 from 9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. at the Lafayette County Highway Department located at 12016 Hill Street, Darlington, WI 53530. The meeting will also have a link available on the Lafayette County website (<https://www.lafayettecountywi.org/highway>) to attend virtually. Residents are encouraged to attend via whichever format works best for them.

Lafayette County will replace the existing CTH O bridge with new single-span concrete flat slab bridge over Ames Branch in Section 21, T2N, R2E. The County will also replace the existing CTH C bridge with a new two-span concrete flat slab bridge over Bonner Branch in Section 8, T3N, R3E. The roadway approaches at both structures will be reconstructed. Work will consist of bridge removal, grading, concrete masonry, crushed aggregate base course, asphalt pavement, guardrail, erosion control items, and landscaping items.

During construction, both CTH O & CTH C will be closed at the structures. Work is scheduled to take place in the summer of 2023.

The purpose of the meeting is to present the preliminary plans of the work scheduled for the bridge construction projects, discuss the proposed schedule, and gather public input. Any comments that may be of interest to the design team are welcome.

The meeting will be organized in an open-house format and interested persons are invited to attend at their convenience. There will be a presentation at the onset to provide an overview of the projects followed by questions. Representatives from Lafayette County and Ayres will be available to discuss the design details, address comments, and answer questions. Displays showing the proposed project will be available for viewing.

Persons with a concern or knowledge about historic buildings and structures, public lands, and archaeological sites are encouraged to attend this meeting or provide comments to Lafayette County.
